I will sign off here and allow you to dream into the future!







### Crystal gazing into Tomorrow's technologies

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# **My tiny Corporate Stint!**

It was during late July-2014. Our team was working at an Audit in Mumbai. This was the time I was has informed that I would be undertaking a very prestigious client as my next assignment. I was told that we have had and still continue to have a very good relation with them and it was my responsibility to maintain the same, if not add some more to it.

During the first week, I was like the lead role in the film "Life of pi" - alone in the corporate ocean, with the ferocious animal for company—my laptop. Since the assignment has started immediately after the previous assignment, neither did I have the time to refer at least to the user interface of SAP nor could get a detailed description of my role. Only later did I come to



know that these are things which can never be totally explained but can only experienced.

Coming to the role, I would gladly like to share some of the important learnings I came across both in technical and managerial areas. To give a brief introduction, I was given the role of finance controller assistance, in the unit-"Biologics" a job given to a CA/CWA who must have at least two years of post-qualification experience in a manufacturing company. That's what my boss (at the client) has told me while describing the importance or rather the seriousness of my role.

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Firstly, I should thank the entire team of the department for their never ending support. They always had an option to replace me with a more experienced personnel after judging the nil level of expo-



sure I had .At every point of time, they were kind enough to accept my limitations and were patient enough to teach me all the technical aspects of their organization. Technical aspects are the crux for efficient working and can be achieved through regular training and proper understanding with a minimal struggle.

If you ask me anything notable to share in the technical aspects, I would rather like to focus on the structure of work rather than about the work. SAP is the mother for

any data. Having said that, there may be some outside adjustments owing to certain inherent limitations of the business unit. The Profit and loss account and Balance sheet have well defined formats and once the trial balance is extracted a mere "vlookup" will prepare the balance sheet and Profit and loss account. So basically, the doing part is a mere 30% and the controlling, verifying, rectifying part is the major 70%. Review and analysis follow.

In this regard, what I may term as my major job satisfaction, is the reporting of monthly performance to CFO and council heads. I understood the crux of reporting i.e. what to report and what not to and how to give optimum useful data in a single slide of a power point. You need to be crisp, able to judge the importance and have any adjustments done cautiously so that the report displays the correct figures. The way we have gone about it is the best way of working I have ever done and it was a major step in improving my Excel and PowerPoint skills. The project was initiated when I was in my 3rd month of the assignment and was appreciated by the CFO.

Now you keep hearing in several programs/ seminars/orientation/GMCS, the faculty start with the phrases "In the outside", "In the corporate world" etc., whenever they are about to discuss anything re-

garding the soft skills. From my experience in those 7 months I have experienced how important soft skills are going to play an important role in our personal as well as professional development.

Analyze yourself, analyze the environment and how much synchronization are you in with the environment. You are going to work in a team. Learn to accept others limitations especially of persons in higher authority. Yes they do ISSUE 1, 2015 PAGE 8

Because whatever you do, they are going to get the job done through you. There are several harsh realities in the corporate world but I can say that the place

Absorbing pressure under unfavorable conditions — You work in a corporate, you! conditions apsuffer it; but when you accept it, you become the master of it and you start praising MS Dhoni all the more. One good tip is to avoid unnecessary pressure and I have learnt it

through my Finance head. For example, there is an urgent report to be circulated on say 18th August which is Saturday. You need not break your heads out to do it on Friday night because no one is going to read it Friday night or Saturday or Sunday. So try to be practical sometimes than always be firm with the rules. Of course, conditions apply.

Team outings develop the bonds to a some extent and leaving the work at workplace is a great thing to do. I have been a part of two team outings and have never seen my finance head or vice-president discuss about work for more than 10 minutes. It is certainly difficult to overcome but work-life balance is as important as any other quality for a professional. You sometimes cannot help it but should at least try it.

I would like to conclude here because as I said, it is more about experience than about explanation. I hope I was able to throw light at least on some aspects which are new to certain article students. And once again I would like to thank our firm for the great opportunity. It is an opportunity which I am proud of and which others can be jealous of.
